Makes Good on P.R.

This past fall the KAPPA SIGMA ZETA was very busy working on its public image. Having a dinner reception for our honoraries, participating as ambulance victims, helping with the set-up and take-down of the Red Cross Blood-mobile, and raising money for the American Cancer Society were all projects that attest to this fact.

On October thirteenth we were pleased to entertain 15 honoraries and active local alumni at a wine and cheese reception that preceded an excellent roast beef dinner. Our thanks goes out to Bev, our cook, for a great job in preparing the food for so many extra people.

It was the evening of November 9 that Don Koglmeier (KS 1070) was shot with an arrow in the chest, Jim Oake (KS 1078) had a heart attack, and Kevin Hunt (KS 1091) experienced hypothermia.

All of these "accidents" were mock set-ups, a drill used to aid Ambulance Corps Volunteers. It was quite a sight to see one of our brothers stumble into our weekly meeting with an arrow protruding from his chest, and blood all over his front! Everyone was relieved to see him getting up off the floor and parade the mock equipment around, painlessly, I might add.

The big project for the semester was our Second Annual Run for Cancer. On October 31, the brothers took turns running a 1.5 mile course around campus from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. Donations were given by students, administration, and local businesses in the form of pledges per mile or flat sums of money. One hundred and two miles were covered within the time limit. We then proceeded to collect the money and on November 24, we handed over \$1,051.44 to an overjoyed Gail Hardy, a representative of the Allegany Chapter of the American Cancer Society. This project gave us the most benefit because we received food publicity from the Alfred, Wellsville and Hornell newspapers and radio stations.

With this kind of brotherhood participation, I feel it has been a good fall in terms of honoring and spreading the good name of Lambda Chi.

This year brothers have worked very hard putting new stairs at the front of the house, putting new lights along the front of the house, building a sound booth in the party room to protect house stereo equipment, improving the bar area, and improving individual rooms, as well as painting all through the house and kitchen. The Housing Corporation donated monies to putting up wood on all stairwells and the third floor to prevent damage and to improve appearances. They also spent over \$2,000 to rewire throughout the house for safety purposes.
