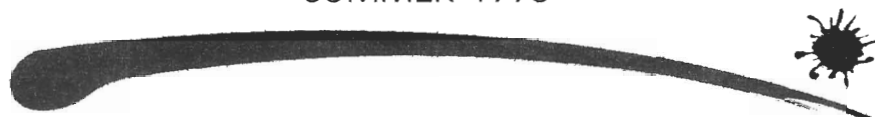

Also, the Coat of Arms that was painted on the wall of the second floor hallway by Adam Lenio was unveiled. After being covered by a painted piece of Plexiglas for the past five years it survived. Good work Adam!! Only a little mold was at the bottom of the wall, but that was not on the Coat of Arms itself. The brothers of Kappa Sigma were moving out when we uncovered it and were surprised to find out that it was there all these years.

The Cross and Crescent that was hanging behind the bar was also unveiled. It was finally beginning to look like home. The brothers were excited about getting started and started to clean and remove all debris from the house. They also began to tear down the wall between the TV room and party room. The renovation had begun!!

International Housing Conference

The National Fraternity has taken an active role in helping the Housing Corporations assure that their properties are maintained safely. The International Housing Conference that was held in May in Philadelphia was the second of its kind in the past year. Sponsored and funded by the Lambda Chi Alpha Education Foundation approximately 30 housing corporations from around the country were present. Discussions included how to control insurance premiums and be more proactive than reactive to housing situations. Alcohol was discussed along with house safety. Did you know that the chance of having a fire in your home this year is 1 in 1200 while the chances of having a fire in our fraternity house is 1 in 10. Fire in a Fraternity house can be and in most cases is fatal.

The National has instituted a loan program in which any chapter wishing to install sprinklers throughout their chapter house will be able to get a loan from the National. This loan would be paid back through premium savings over a period of time. Once the loan is repaid the chapter would then receive the insurance savings. Based on our premiums our savings would be about \$4,000.00 per year. This is a win win situation and we are currently looking into it.

The International Housing Conferences will be held again over the next year. Manuals will be written to help the Housing corporations deal with many of the day to day issues.

RENOVATION PHASE II



Once again we have building in our blood. As we put our letters back on the house we need to bring the building up to code and make several improvements.

On Monday, May 18th the house was full of workers getting ready for the second phase of the renovation. This phase will include finishing the party, TV, and chapter rooms. These areas will be getting new floors, new paint and lighting. The TV room will be open to the Party room as it was originally constructed in the 70's. The sound booth will receive a complete overhaul. The fireplace hearth will be replaced and the stone fireplace and the bar front will be cleaned. The bar top will be refinished and the ladies room will be renovated. All rooms in the house will receive a thorough cleaning and painting. All bathrooms will have vinyl panels installed in the shower stalls to prevent mildew. All showers will also receive new shower heads and all doors will get a new master keyed lock system with deadbolts. The entire house will be outfitted with a smoke/fire detection system that will be hard wired to central station. Along with this fire system will be a security system. The stairs off the back of the sleeping porch will be replaced. Many other things will be done to the house to bring it up to code and make it safer for the residents.

Yvonne, next years cook, began cleaning and disinfecting all rooms and bathrooms on Monday May 18th. A crew of brothers and their friends and girlfriends stayed for several days to help clean the house and get it ready for the contractors. Over 130 bags of garbage were removed from the house along with several couches that were left behind by Kappa Sigma Fraternity. The work crew not only cleaned, they painted and fixed many damaged items in the house. They even opened the wall between the party and TV room. This was done the first day we took the house back.

A work/party weekend is planned for the middle of July. With the help of all of the brothers we can put the finishing touches on the house.

By the Fall when our brothers return to Alfred they will have the safest and best Fraternity house of all.

Getting the House Back

On Sunday May 17th the 4 year lease with Kappa Sigma Fraternity came to an end. As the tenants moved out the brothers of Lambda Chi were thanked for a good four years and the use of the house.

Thanks to the help of several Kappa Sigma brothers and Alfred University officials the end of the lease was uneventful. Damages to the house were not as bad as expected. After a full year of rumors that the house was going to be destroyed by its tenants we were pleased to find that all we really had to contend with was a lot of garbage and dirt. Most of the work needed was strictly cosmetic.

When the renovations are over and all the bills are totaled Kappa Sigma will receive a bill from us for damages above and beyond normal wear and tear. The estimated damage bill is in the neighborhood of \$6,000.00. The University will help us to collect on this debt.

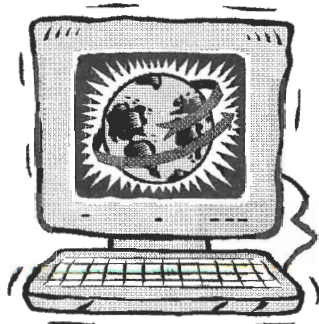
