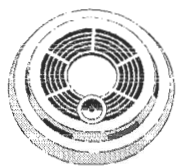

These new members of the Board will bring new ideas and will help the board to continue to move forward.

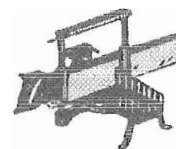

# Renovation Phase II Complete



During the summer months the Alumni Association spent nearly \$50,000.00 on renovations to the chapter house. Damages left by the previous tenants were minimal. The renovations consisted of new tile floors in the party, TV and old Chapter rooms. These floors along with the kitchen floor received 5 coats of wax and all of the carpets throughout the main areas were shampooed. The entire house received two new coats of paint from top to bottom. Yvonne cleaned and disinfected the entire house including all of the bathrooms and common areas. The ladies room off the party room received new walls. All holes were repaired and some walls were replaced with 3/4 plywood. A new master keyed lock system was installed throughout the house. An ADT central station fire and burglar alarm system was installed. The old fluorescent fixtures were removed from the halls and new energy efficient lighting was installed in all of the common areas and hallways. The kitchen also received new lighting. The auxiliary heaters in both the game room and the new chapter room were put on automatic timers. The electrical system was brought up to code with GFI's and the replacement of many switches, fixtures & panel boxes that were defective. Mildew resistant walls were installed in all bathrooms along with new shower heads. Additional lighting was installed on the outside of the house along with new stairs leading off the old sleeping porch in the rear. A new slate hearth replaced the old cement one in the Game room (old Chapter Room). New screens were purchased for all windows in the house. The sliding glass doors in the old soda room were removed and a new fire exit door was installed. New furniture was purchased for the boarding club and for the card room (old TV room). Automatic door closers were put on all fire doors in the halls and on all exit doors. A new pool table and foos ball table were purchased and two coin operated video machines were installed in the card room. These jobs plus many other small items were completed prior to the return of the brothers.

We also passed the building inspection with flying colors. In fact we were one of the few buildings in Alfred that got a two year Certificate of Occupancy. In other words we do not need another inspection until the year 2000. The inspector could find absolutely nothing wrong with the building. We had succeeded in making the house the safest house on campus.

## Congratulations and Thanks

At the Luncheon that was held on Saturday October 3, 1998 The Martha B. Fissell Memorial Award was presented to two women who supported the fraternity not only in spirit but in physical labor. Beth Pysnik and Heather Neil. Beth started out as a tenant in the house this past summer but spent several hours each day cleaning, painting and doing whatever needed to be done to get the house ready for the fall. Heather, who was our head resident for the spring semester did nothing less. She not only managed the house during the summer but she spent all of her extra time working on making the house the best it could be. Both women, painted a second Coat of Arms for the new chapter room and a new sign for the front hill.

As friends of the Fraternity we awarded them the Martha Fissell Memorial. Their name will be added to the plaque that currently hangs in the Chapter Room. We thank them for their ongoing support and dedication to the fraternity.

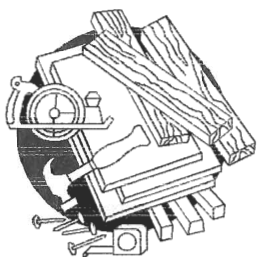

## RENOVATION CONTINUES PHASE III

The maintenance of the Chapter House is an ongoing project. Over the past 6 years we have put more than \$170,000.00 into the house. We do have a reserve fund that is funded every year through rental income. This fund is for major projects such as the roof, driveway, furnace etc..



Aside from these projects there are still many items that are needed. This final phase of renovation to take place next summer will consist of the following items; the entire house will be wired for Internet access as was done to all dorms on campus by the University. This will allow the brothers fast access to the Internet. The new Chapter room and TV room (the old sleeping porch has been split for this purpose) will get new flooring and the chapter room will be furnished as a formal Chapter Room. A gas insert will be installed into the fireplace located in the New Game room. Along with these items we will also be renovating the Kitchen with new shelving and counters, all of which will be stainless steel.

The total estimate for this work is \$30,000.00. Donations for this phase of the renovation would be greatly appreciated. Projects like these are in need of Alumni support. Please use the attached coupon in this newsletter to send in your donation.

# Dean H. Fredericks, KΣ 58 Charter Member AU Hall of Fame

Dean Hayes Fredericks, class of 1929 passed away on May 11, 1998.

Dean graduated from Alfred University as a Ceramic Engineer in 1929. At the age of 16 he played his first college game for Alfred and at the age of 18 he was elected captain of the Saxons. Dean won 10 varsity letters in Football, Track, and Wrestling. His first Alfred game was against Rutgers University, New Brunswick, NJ. The quarterback for Rutgers at the time was Ozzie Nelson.

Dean played four years of varsity football at Alfred. He was outstanding on the wrestling team. He set Saxon records in the hurdles and the high jump as a member of the track team. He won the high jump at the Middle Atlantic States championships in 1928.

Born in Lockhaven, PA Dean played three years with a high school team that won the state championships. He also played three years of pro football with Buffalo and Rochester teams.

In 1973 Dean was inducted as a Charter Member into the Alfred University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Dean worked for Carborundum in Niagara Falls, NY for over 40 years setting a company record.

At the time of his death Dean was residing in Sun City, Arizona. He is survived by his wife Mayme, and two sons, Dean H. III and Douglas.

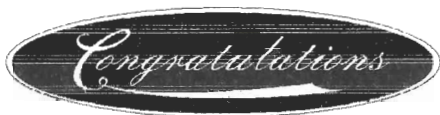

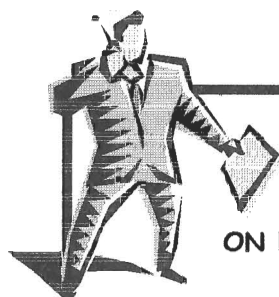

# *An Old House Manager's Job Is Never Done!*

After four undergraduate years at Alfred rebuilding and maintaining the "frat house", and then the years served on the Housing Corp. in which we refurbished" and refinished" the house yet again, one would think that I would be tired of "renovation" activities!!

Oh quite the contrary! My latest challenge has been the toughest challenge of all! Recently I purchased a piece of history-the house known as "Diamond Jim Brady's Farm---the farm where it was written in the press of the turn-of-the-century that "cows were milked into gold buckets."

While Diamond Jim was not the first owner of the house, he was the most aggressive in terms of renovation. The house was originally built by a Dutch architect named Vecht, c. 1860, on a piece of land purchased from the Leni Lenape Indians of New Jersey. The land lay at the confluence of the South Branch and the North Branch of the Raritan River, in what



is present day Hillsborough Township. Diamond Jim, famous Railroad Baron/Gambler/Raucous NYC Socialite, bought the house in 1903 for \$68,000.00, as a gift for his mistress. He then renovated the house to become what could be analogous to the original Playboy Mansion! He spent \$163,000.00 putting in an equestrian center, lawn tennis courts, gardens, a swimming pool, and massive upgrades to the main house (including embossed tin ceilings throughout) and the addition of a guest house.

Diamond Jim was well known for having wild parties that lasted for days at the estate, and often brought prize fighters from NYC to the estate to have boxing matches with the area farm men. Many a wild poker game occurred at the house, that gave rise to the turn-of-the-century saying of how good life was as "good as on Brady's farm."

Diamond Jim sold the house to poet Robert Frost, who lived there quietly for several years, eventually subletting the property to Albert Einstein (as legend has it). Eventually, the property was split up and sold off till it reached its current size of 3.5 acres -- with the guest house being sold off to my neighbor.

The house had not been lived in for nearly 12 years when I found it -- and fell in love with it! I have spent nearly a year so far in upgrading electrical, heating, plumbing, insulation, roofing, gutters, lawn, gardens, walls, ceilings, and woodworks. And I still have a long way to go!! But, as we all know, nothing worthwhile comes easily!! And so I continue my challenge to bring majestic home back to life. 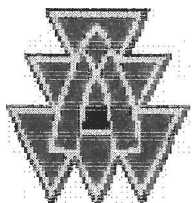

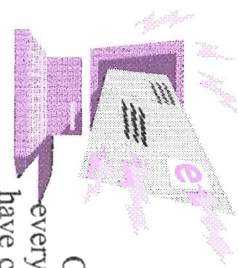
